About the Stage Managers' Association

The Stage Managers' Association of the United States (SMA) is the only professional organization for working Stage Managers across the United States.

Our mission is to create and maintain a strong community of Stage Managers by:

- 1. Protecting and promoting the interests of professional Stage Managers;
- 2. Serving as a resource and networking hub for the dissemination and advancement of ideas and developments in the craft of stage management;
- 3. Recognizing and promoting the recognition of professional Stage Managers at all career levels; and
- 4. Educating and advising those interested in the art and techniques of stage management.

The Del Hughes Award

The Del Hughes Award for Lifetime Achievement in the Art of Stage Management is presented by The Stage Managers' Association. The Del Hughes honor is awarded to those who represent the finest qualities and artistic achievement in stage management throughout their lifelong career.

Del Hughes (1909-1985) was an American theater performer, stage manager, and television director. Prior to establishing his career as a stage manager, Hughes performed in several Broadway productions, including *Vickie* (1942), *Yours, A. Lincoln* (1942) and *Open House* (1947). Hughes managed dozens of Broadway productions, including the premiere of Arthur Miller's *Death of a Salesman* in 1949, as well as works by Lillian Hellman and Graham Greene. In the late 1960s and early 1970s, Hughes directed episodes of the television dramas "One Life to Live" and "All My Children." The Del Hughes prompt books, archived in the Billy Rose Collection at the New York Public Library at Lincoln Center, date from 1943 to 1968 and represent twenty-four Broadway productions.

Upon his passing in 1985, his daughter, Julie Hughes, created a legacy for her father with the Stage Managers' Association, the Del Hughes Award for Lifetime Achievement in the Art of Stage Management.

Del Hughes Honoree Bios

Jill Cordle graduated from University of Missouri - Columbia in 1982 and spent nine months as SM/TD/Truck Driver for a children's theatre company, performing in every state east of the Mississippi. She next spent eighteen months on faculty at Southern Illinois University – Edwardsville as TD in a new black box theatre.

Later, Jill went for an MA in theatre at Illinois State University - Bloomington/Normal. The program offered an internship at Manhattan Theater Club, so she came

to New York in 1987 expecting to work and then return to finish her degree. She ended up staying in NYC, meeting and marrying fellow stage manager, Ira Mont.

Jill spent the next ten years working on tour, regionally, and off-Broadway. She got her AEA card in 1988 on a Theatreworks USA tour. Other tours include The Boys Choir of Harlem, MOMIX Dance Theatre across the US and Europe, *Annie Warbucks, Catskills On Broadway*, and a year as PSM of the national tour of *Cats*. Regionally, Jill worked at Virginia Stage Company, Emelin Theatre, and Westport Country, Cape and Ogunquit Playhouses. NYC theatres include MCC, The Women's Project, Westside Arts, EST, Variety Arts and The Drama League.

Jill had her first child before making her Broadway debut in 1998 on ART. More than two dozen Broadway credits include True West with Philip Seymour Hoffman and John C. Reilly (after which her second child was born), Glengarry Glen Ross with Alan Alda and Liev Schreiber, The Odd Couple with Nathan Lane and Matthew Broderick, God of Carnage, Jerusalem with Mark Rylance, The Audience with Helen Mirren, The Gin Game with James Earl Jones and Cicely Tyson, The Ferryman, The Inheritance (two parts), and her final show, Pictures From Home with Nathan Lane, Danny Burstein and Zoë Wanamaker. Directors she's worked with include Matthew Warchus, Stephen Daldry, Sam Gold, Joe Mantello and Mike Nichols.

Jill has decided to retire from stage management. She is thrilled to leave room for others to move up and take her place.

Marjorie Horne turned from performing to stage management in 1973 at Circle Repertory Company. She was assigned the ASM position on *When You Comin' Back, Red Ryder?* starring Kevin Conway. This seemed to be her calling, and Marshall Mason next asked her to PSM his production of *The Prodigal* starring Judd Hirsch. She stayed at Circle Rep that season, even getting to act in E. E. Cummings' *him* starring Lanford Wilson.

The Off-Broadway arena became Marjorie's home for many years. Besides two very successful commercial productions (*I'm Getting My Act Together and Taking It On The Road* for The Public Theater and *Greater Tuna*), Marjorie has worked for almost every Off-Broadway theater company in NYC. Some of her favorite productions include *Life Class* for Manhattan Theater Club, 2nd Stage's revival of *Short Eyes* directed by Kevin Conway, *Dog Opera* directed by Gerry Gutierrez, Tony Kushner's *A Bright Room Called Day* directed by Michael Greif for The Public, *Northeast Local* directed by Gutierrez for Lincoln Center Theater, *Goodnight Children Everywhere*, written/directed by Richard Nelson and *Boys and Girls*, directed by Gutierrez for Playwrights Horizons.

In 2002, Marjorie transitioned to the events arena, stage managing events that include the Clinton Global Initiative and Career Transition For Dancers galas, IBM Golden Global Circle Awards, V-Day Presentations at Madison Square Garden & The Apollo Theater, the 9/11 Memorial reading of the names, other not-for-profit and political events, including directing the 2000 NYS Democratic Convention. Currently she stage manages the Citizens' Union Awards, the HANYC Foundation Gala, and the Broadway Green Alliance's Earth Day Concert in Times Square. From 2006-2025, Marjorie served as Production Supervisor of The Tony Awards.

Marjorie is very proud of her service to the theatrical community. She is a former Actors' Equity Councilor, a founding member/former Chair of the SMA, a founding member of the Foundation for Stage Managers, and a former staff/ Board member and current member of the Advisory Council for The Broadway Green Alliance.

Judy Martel has happily spent 40 of her 50+ stage managing years working in Milwaukee, where she was the Production Stage Manager at Milwaukee Chamber Theatre for 35 seasons. For 20 years, MCT produced the only professional Shaw Festival in the U.S. Some memorable productions there include: the full 5-hour Man and Superman, Angels in America: Perestroika, Master Class, Hedwig and the Angry Inch, Beyond the Fringe, and The Real Thing. She has also stage managed with The Milwaukee Rep, Next Act Theatre, Renaissance

Theatreworks, Peninsula Players, and Black Arts Milwaukee.

Growing up in a theatre-going home in Urbana, Illinois, Judy's interest began in junior high. She was somehow drawn to stage management early, starting as an ASM/Chorus member of *The Music Man*. In college, Judy studied theater, math/computer science, and linguistics at Cornell University, and ended up majoring in theater and doing summer stock with The Station Theatre, Geneva Summer Theatre, and Hangar Theatre Company.

Judy received an MFA in Technical Design and Production/Stage Management from the Yale School of Drama, where she was on the stage management team for Robert Brustein's final production at Yale Rep. After graduating, she stage managed for Yale Rep, becoming a member of AEA.

In 1983, while stage managing *June Moon* at Manhattan Punch Line, Judy was introduced to the fledgling Stage Managers' Association. She joined, shadowed some Broadway shows, and has been an active member ever since. In 2020, Judy was honored with a Lifetime Professional Membership.

In Milwaukee, Judy joined AEA committees to advocate for Wisconsin, stage managers, and small professional theaters. She eventually became chair of the Milwaukee/Madison Liaison Committee and was the Wisconsin delegate to two national conventions.

Judy is an avid theatergoer, seeking productions wherever she goes. She is also a freelance editor and writer. She has two wonderful daughters, only one of whom escaped working in the theater. And two years ago, she became a grandmother.

Lisa Dawn Cave was raised in Brooklyn, NY. She attended the High School of Performing Arts and received her BFA in Dance from SUNY Purchase.

Her professional theatre career started as a dancer/singer where she performed in *Cats, Jerome Robbins' Broadway*, the 1992 revival of *Guys and Dolls, Bubblin' Brown Sugar* and *Golden Boy*.

After 10 years of performing on stage, Lisa Dawn's career transitioned to behind the scenes, where she has worked consistently in stage management for over 30 years. These credits include the Broadway productions of Frozen, Shuffle Along, Fun Home, Rocky, The Humans, Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, Bring It On, West Side Story (2009), Come Fly Away, The Color Purple, Hot Feet, The Caine Mutiny Court Martial, The Woman In White, Julius Caesar, Caroline or Change, Hollywood Arms, Into the Woods, Wild Party, Parade, Smokey Joe's Café and the 1994 Revival of Showboat. She has worked with Creatives: Hal Prince, George C. Wolfe, James Lapine, Jerry Zaks, Kenny Leon, Thomas Kail, Sam Gold, Daryl Waters, Jeanine Tesori, Lynn Ahrens, Stephen Flaherty, Alex Lacamoire, Tom Kitt, Jason Robert Brown, Lisa Kron, Lin-Manuel Miranda, Maurice Hines, Rob Ashford, Andy Blankenbuehler, Alex Timbers, Hope Clark, Savion Glover and Christopher Gattelli.

Lisa Dawn is currently the Production Supervisor for Disney's *The Lion King* and *Frozen* worldwide, along with the re-imagined *Aida*, which played the Netherlands in 2023.

In addition to her theatre credits, Lisa Dawn serves on the Board of Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS, an Advisor for the Prince Fellowship, a founding member of both Black Theatre United and Broadway & Beyond: Access for Stage Managers of Color and has served as an elected Councilor for Actors Equity Association for 12 years. Her most recent accolade was the recipient of the 2023 Tony Honors for Excellence in Theatre. Namaste!

Special Recognition Award

SMA



Broadway Advocacy Coalition's mission is to unite artists and advocates to create performances that advance justice and systemic change. They combine storytelling with lived experience for action and impact. BAC currently focuses a majority of its work on initiatives connected to the criminal legal system in New York City and State.

In 2016, a group of Broadway actors from the all-Black cast of *Shuffle Along* joined-together with local activists to answer the question: "How can the arts play a more meaningful role in creating a just world?" Frustrated by both the country's and theater industry's response - or lack thereof - to the nation's pandemic of racism, those "artivists" sensed a different strategy was needed to tackle today's most pressing issues. That impulse grew into Broadway Advocacy Coalition: a boundary-pushing advocacy nonprofit utilizing workshops, coalition building, leadership development, and Impact Projects to create more humane policies. BAC has since grown into a Tony Award-winning organization that convenes artists, change leaders, and individuals impacted by systemic racism and oppression to build the capacity and coalitions that fuel systemic change.

Vision:

BAC believes the arts and storytelling can uniquely help to:

- Envision and communicate a world without systemic racism and the carceral state;
- Move people in all positions of power and influence (from community-based power to political power) to take tangible action towards creating that world;
- Reframe, counter, and replace dominant narratives that uphold and contribute to systemic racism.

BAC believes arts-based advocacy is a critical and rigorous practice that complements long-term social justice organizing. For more information, please visit bwayadvocacycoalition.org.

Supporting the Career Stage Manager

During the "great artistic pause," the Stage Managers' Association Board asked a bold question: What's next for our field?

Stage managers are the heartbeat of live entertainment—yet most work gig to gig, without institutional budgets to back them up. Access to professional development, networking, and resources is the biggest obstacle to building sustainable careers.

So the SMA took action with a grant for initial expenses to create this organization and The Foundation for Stage Managers was born—its own organization, that, working from a separate 501 c 3 designation, could raise funds from our community and beyond, to directly support individual gig workers and organizations training the next generation of stage managers across the United States.

We're young but determined. Already, we've launched a small grants program and are building two sustaining initiatives:

- The Pat Trott Fund for SMA Education
- The Marybeth Abel Stage Management Fellowship

These programs, once fully vested, will beginfunneling resources, funding, and supporting access for stage managers across the United States.




