About the Black Theatre Caucus

Founded in 2020, the Black Theatre Caucus (BTC) is committed to implore governing bodies in the theatrical community to use their full power, statutory authority, and financial resources to ensure that Black or African Diaspora identifying individuals pursuing a career in the theatre industry have the ability to achieve equal: representation, access, and opportunity in the theatrical field. They seek to educate, empower, and address Black or African Diaspora Identifying member concerns by aggressively pursuing policy and creating spaces for development and fellowship. The Black Theatre Caucus works with established industry entities and educational institutions on behalf of black theatre practitioners using these four guiding principles: Visibility, Advocacy, Education, and Outreach.
