The Del Hughes Award

SMA

The Del Hughes Award for Lifetime Achievement in the Art of Stage Management is presented by the SMA to those who represent the finest qualities and artistic achievement in stage management throughout their life-long career.

Del Hughes (1909-1985) was an American theater performer, stage manager, and television director. Prior to establishing his career as a stage manager, Hughes performed in several Broadway productions, including *Vickie* (1942), *Yours, A. Lincoln* (1942) and *Open House* (1947). Hughes managed dozens of Broadway productions, including the premiere of Arthur Miller's *Death of a Salesman* (1949), as well as works by Lillian Hellman and Graham Greene. In the late 1960s and early 1970s, Hughes directed episodes of the television dramas "One Life to Live" and "All My Children." Hughes' prompt books, archived in the Billy Rose Collection at the New York Public Library at Lincoln Center, date from 1943 to 1968 and represent twenty-four Broadway productions.

Upon his passing in 1985, his daughter, Julie Hughes, created a legacy for her father with the Stage Managers' Association -- the Del Hughes Lifetime Achievement Award in the Art of Stage Management. In 1986, the first award was presented to Phil Friedman.

Andrew Feigin's career as a stage manager (AEA, AGVA, AGMA, DGA) began in 1975 after graduating from Cornell University with the premier season of Ithaca's Hangar Theater. In 1976 he moved to southern California and the South Coast Repertory, got his Equity card, and met fellow stage manager, Mimi Apfel, who he would eventually marry. After moving back to New York in 1980 Andrew did residencies with numerous LORT theatres including the Great Lakes Shakespeare Festival (where he met longtime SMA Chair Elynmarie Kazle) and the Guthrie Theater.

In 1984 he began a 30-year association with Radio City Music Hall. While stage managing numerous productions on "The Great Stage," he found time to assist Bob Bennett on *Nick & Nora*, sub on *Cats* and *Phantom of the Opera*, and stage manage noteworthy productions with the Brooklyn Academy of Music including the Philip Glass/Robert Wilson opera *the CIVIL warS* and Peter Brooks' productions of *The Mahabharata* and *The Cherry Orchard*. In the world of opera, he stage managed the world premiere of Tan Dun's *Marco Polo* directed by Martha Clarke and served two seasons as PSM at NY City Opera. Andy has enjoyed a decades long association with The National Dance Institute founded by NY City Ballet great, Jacques d'Amboise. As a DGA member, he has stage managed numerous broadcast events such as the Tony Awards and the Kennedy Center Honors.

For two decades with AppleFig Productions he has stage managed hundreds of events for prominent corporations including Intel, Toyota, Pfizer, PepsiCo, Deloitte, and non-profits including United Way, Women's Sports Foundation, Robin Hood. Andy has taught stage management at NYU and SUNY Stony Brook. With the SMA, he served many years as a Board Director-at-large, co-edited years of 'The Headset', chaired the Nominations Committee, and hosted several Del Hughes Awards Ceremonies. He and Mimi have been married 38 years and are the proud parents of Ben (wife Allison) and Hannah (husband Langdon) and grandparents of Olivia Astrid!

New Jersey native **Raymond Menard** began his music studies on piano and clarinet as a child. While a student at Mountain Lakes H.S. he attended a dress rehearsal of *Salome* at the Metropolitan Opera where he was badly bitten by the opera bug. Resolving to make his life's work somewhere in opera, he studied music at the New England Conservatory of Music and theater at Pratt Institute.

In 1978, Ray joined the staff of the New York City Opera as Stage Director and later became that company's Artistic Administrator, winning the Julius Rudel prize for excellence in Artistic Administration. While at City Opera, Ray was fortunate to have worked on several productions at the Washington Opera and began honing his stage management chops at the Sarasota Opera. In 1987, he was recruited by the Metropolitan Opera to join its Stage Management team and has served as the Met's Production Stage Manager from 2010 until his retirement from that position in 2022.



Throughout his career, Ray has found special joy in teaching. He directed operas at Augusta University in Georgia and, since 2010, Ray has had the pleasure of teaching music to the stage management students at the Graduate School of the Arts at Columbia University. Ray joined the American Federation of Musicians in 1971 and AGMA in 1978. He is a lifetime member and current president of the American Guild of Musical Artists. Ray is married to the love of his life, singer and vocal coach Laura Menard. They reside in Boonton Township, NJ, with their two daughters, one son-in-law, a grandson, and a small menagerie of cats and dogs.



Bernita Robinson

I had dreams of becoming a professional stage manager at the age of 13 thanks to chance meeting with Ivan Curry at a benefit for the Girl Scouts in New York City. Mr. Curry explained stage management and I was hooked. His advice was "Do everything at least once. Try your hand at props, sound and lights. Be a dresser, a scene painter, etc. It will give you a better understanding of what it takes to put a show together." While in high school, I followed Mr. Curry's advice I began my theatrical career doing whatever job I could find ... until I was hired as an assistant stage manager. This

resulted in my taking over as stage manager during the dress rehearsal. I continued to work until my first AEA contract came to do a new show in Clayton, NY. My career has taken me all over the United States, Canada and, briefly – South Africa. I have worked Regional, Off-Broadway, and Broadway. Among the shows I've done: Sarafina, Cats, Jelly's Last Jam (original), Show Boat, Ragtime (world premiere, Broadway tour), Aida, Beauty and the Beast, Man of

La Mancha, Thurgood, Feed the Dragon, On Golden Pond, Roof of the World, Carmen Jones, off-Broadway's recent Assassins and Broadway's recent revival of for colored girls who have considered suicide/ when the rainbow is enuf. For the past 10 years I have served the AEA membership as a member of the governing body. I am humbled by this honor.



Marguerite Price is honored to be recognized for her contributions to the SMA. In Margie's nearly 30-year career, she was privileged to support the artists at theatres within the Eastern Region and at her artistic homes in the Greater Philadelphia Area: Act II Playhouse (10 seasons), Delaware Theatre Company (5 seasons), Bristol Riverside Theatre (4 seasons) and Foundation Theatre (6 seasons). Margie served as a member of the Philadelphia AEA Liaison Committee 1992 – 2007 (Chair, 2005-2006). She joined the SMA Board of Directors in 2003, retired in 2021 and was

pleased to serve as Chair in 2007-2008.


In 2000, she took a break from stage management and had the good fortune of being hired by David-Michael Kenney as his Production Associate. Putting David-Michael's community-building ideas into action, Margie became a "social director." Through monthly event announcements sent to the SMA, Margie came to the attention of then-Chairman, Rich Costabile. In 2003, he tapped her to run for a position on the SMA Board of Directors with the intent that she would lead the fledgling Regional Representation Committee. With that election, she took ownership of the task to build a national presence for the Association.

During Margie's tenure as Chair of the Regional Representation Committee, membership in that committee grew to 78 covering 26 states. Forums, CPR training, job fairs, stage combat classes, roundtable panels, Observations and "drink nights" were hosted by members across the country. Guidelines, protocols and reimbursement for activities were now in place. Margie advocated for the addition of Eastern, Central and Western Regional Directors to the SMA Board and, in 2009, this became a reality.

Margie currently volunteers as the Prompter Coordinator (and one of the prompters) at Home Made Theater in Saratoga Springs, NY, where she lives with two cats & MS.

Narda E. Alcorn (s/hers) and Lisa Porter (s/hers) have been friends and collaborators since meeting at Yale School of Drama in 1992. In 2020, they published *Stage Management Theory as a Guide to Practice: Cultivating a Creative Approach*, and the essay on HowlRound Theatre Commons, "We Commit to Anti-Racist Stage Management Education." They have presented at universities and leading performing arts organizations including Columbia, Carnegie Mellon, AEA, AGMA, Broadway Stage Management Symposium, Broadway and Beyond, and USITT.

Narda is Professor and Chair of the Stage Management Program at David Geffen School of Drama at Yale University. On Broadway, Narda was a long-time stage manager on the Broadway production of *The Lion King*. Her career has included collaborations with the Tony-winning directors Kenny Leon, Bartlett Sher, and George C. Wolfe. Narda premiered four of Pulitzer Prize winning playwright August Wilson's Century Cycle plays and stage managed two Broadway revivals of his work. Her New York and Regional credits include productions with Denzel Washington, Viola Davis, Billy Crystal, Kevin Kline, Annette Bening, Phylicia Rashad, David Schwimmer, and Richard Foreman.

Lisa is a Professor of Theatre and Dance at the University of California, San Diego, where she has taught stage management to BA and MFA students since 2005. Working in diverse venues on six continents, Lisa's career has included international projects with Laurie Anderson, Mikhail Baryshnikov, Anne Bogart, Hal Hartley, Yo-Yo Ma, and Robert Wilson. She has collaborated on multiple intercultural productions with Singaporean director Ong Keng Sen and TheatreWorks Singapore. Her New York and Regional credits include productions with Christopher Ashley,

Jonathan Demme, Richard Foreman, Tina Landau, Kenny Leon, Suzan-Lori Parks, Darko Tresnjak, and Mark Wing-Davey.



Standing in the Dark

SMA

Inspired by Rachel Zucker and ten initial interviews, the Stage Managers' Association began to record interviews of career stage managers through two series, *Women of Broadway* (interviewed by Amanda Berry) and *The Legacy Project*, under the banner of *Standing in the Dark*. These recordings are made available to the public on a rotating basis via our website at stagemanagers.org. For access to the full library which is continually updated through the work of the Stage Manager History Committee. SMA members must sign in at stagemanagers.org to listen to the entire series.


